### What is Soil Health? Why Should I Care?

Soil health is the capacity of a soil to function

--- (Doran & Parkin, 1993)

- · Reduces inputs and costs
- Soil is a living factory of macroscopic and microscopic workers who need food to eat and places to live and do their work.
- Tillage, fertilizer, livestock, pesticides, and other management tools can be used to improve soil health ... or significantly damage it if not applied correctly.
- Managing for soil health is mostly a matter of maintaining the creatures that comprise the soil food web. It can be accomplished by ...
  - > Disturbing the soil as little as possible
  - Growing as many different species of plants as practical
  - ➤ Keeping living plants in the soil as often as possible
  - ➤ Keeping the soil covered all the time
