#### **Climate Smart Agriculture Grant Program**



- As part of the State of Connecticut Department of Agriculture Climate Smart Agriculture and Forestry Grant program, CT RC & D was awarded a \$ 1 million grant to provide subgrants for climate smart practices and four equipment sharing hubs around the state.
- These hubs will provide an opportunity for farms throughout Connecticut to utilize conservation tillage equipment and other climate smart agricultural equipment that are otherwise cost prohibitive for many farms.
- In 2023, we received farm applications for these four equipment hubs which went before a review committee consisting of representatives from the Conservation Districts, UCONN Extension, the Veteran community, RiverCOG, NRCS, and CT RC&D.



# Equipment Hubs

Northeast: No Till Seed Drill, Roller Crimper, Subsoiler, No-till Corn Planter.

Northwest: Mobile Unit with walk behind tractor, attachments and hand tools. Roller crimper, flail mower, compost tea kit, Jang seeder.

<u>CT River Valley</u>: Mobile Unit with walk-behind tractor, attachments and hand tools. Roller Crimper, no till transplanter and seed drill with trailers for transportation.

CT Farmer Veteran: Mobile Unit with walk behind tractor, attachments and hand tools. Post hole auger, post driver, Compost extractor/application equipment.

#### Climate Smart Agriculture Equipment Hubs Equipment Procurement

- <u>CT Farmer Input</u>: Open application process for farm to signup to participate in the hubs.
- Open Forum: The discussion has been ongoing with the individual farms in each hub as the procurement process has advanced to be sure that the equipment being purchased was suitable and fitting the needs of the farms adequately. Meetings with each group of hub farms also was conducted.
- <u>Quotes</u>: Several quotes for each piece of equipment were obtained with and an effort made to give preference to American made products where possible.
- <u>Purchase and Implement</u>: On May 24<sup>th</sup> 2024, the first piece of large equipment, a Great Plains Seed Drill was delivered to the Northwest Hub!
